## Sheriff announces September report

The Terry County Sheriff's Office cleared six of 16 reported offenses in September, according to the department's latest report.

Deputies cleared three reported cases of theft that month, along with one each of forgery, indecency with a child and terroristic threat, while eight theft cases and one criminal mischief and one burglary of a building all remain outstanding.

The total value of reported-stolen property during September was estimated at \$26,055, of which approximately \$4,500 has been recovered.

Last month's report, which commissioners approved Tuesday, indicated the department received 169 total calls, including seven emergencies, two misdials and 160 other nonemergencies.

The sheriff's department served 27 of 29 civil papers they received in September from Terry County, while the other two were returned. They served three of 17 that they received from other counties, while the other 14 were returned.

Deputies served 58 of 59 subpoenas they received locally and no subpoenas from other counties.

Deputies served 27 of the 32 warrants they received from Terry County agencies, including four for Justice of the Peace, 10 for County Court and 13 for District Court. Ten local warrants remained outstanding as of Sept. 30 and 23 were returned. They received two warrants in September from other counties, both of which remained outstanding by the end of the month.

Deputies made a combined

total of 10 arrests in September from their own cases and on warrants from other law-enforcement agencies, including two on motions to revoke probation and one each for burglary of a habitation, theft of property valued between \$500 and \$1,500, criminal nonsupport, delivery of less than one gram of cocaine, motion of surety, theft between \$1,500 and \$20,000, theft between \$20,000 and \$100,000 and truancy.

The Terry County Jail had an average daily population of 73 inmates in September.

An average of 39 local inmates stayed at the jail each day that month, as did two inmates from Hockley County and 19.4 federal inmates.

Three prisoners - all male - were transferred last month to various facilities of the Texas Department of Criminal Jus-

tice prison system.

The jail's total income for the year as of Sept. 30 was \$305,302, the majority of which was income from other counties and federal agencies Terry County contracted with to house prisoners.

Office and jail expenses totaled \$32,265 in September. That amount included \$20,828 for groceries, \$7,202 for utilities, \$3,830 for medical expenses and \$1,850 for other jail expenses. The jail served 6,374 meals last month at an average cost of \$3.26 each.

Officers' travel expenses totaled \$5,260 for the month, most of which was for fuel. They drove 2,099 total miles while transferring a total of 15 inmates to and from facilities in Lubbock, Plainview, Littlefield, Abilene and Beaumont.

## Defendants plead in District Court

The following defendants accepted plea-bargained sentences Tuesday in Terry County District Court:

**Alex Espinoza**, 26, pleaded to five years in prison for forgery, a third-degree felony.

Espinoza will also owe \$304 court costs, a \$25 time payment, \$375 attorney fees and \$282 restitution. As part of the plea bargain, the state agreed to dismiss another felony charge he was facing in Terry County District Court.

**Marivelle Garza**, 43, pleaded to 10 years probation for engaging in organized criminal activity, a second-degree felony.

Garza will also owe \$339 court costs, a \$750 fine, \$370 attorney fees and \$4,914 restitution, to be paid jointly with codefendants Annette Snider, Trameisha Wallace and Michelle Quesada. As part of the plea bargain, the state agreed to dismiss another felony charge she was facing in Terry County District Court.

**Caleb Austin Kitchens**, 22, pleaded to six years probation for burglary of a habitation, a second-degree felony.

Kitchens will also owe \$358 court costs, a \$1,000 fine and \$3,435 restitution and will be required to attend Alcoholics/Narcotics Anonymous meetings. If he violates the terms of his probation, he will be sentenced up to six years in prison.

**Heather Lara**, 30, pleaded to five years deferred adjudication for unlawful possession of food stamps, a third-degree felony.

Lara will also owe \$354 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee and \$5,764 restitution. If she adheres to the terms of her probation, the charge will be dismissed in five years.

**Anthony Modesto Ledesma**, 22, pleaded to 10 years probation for fraudulent use or possession of identifying information, a second-degree felony.

Ledesma will also owe \$303 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee, \$1,000 fine, \$2,017 restitution and \$300 attorney fees and will be required to attend Alcoholics/Narcotics Anonymous meetings.

As part of the plea bargain, Ledesma agreed to plead "true" on a misdemeanor motion to revoke probation based with the Terry County Court, and the state agreed to dismiss another misdemeanor charge he was facing in Terry County Court and not to file other forgery faces submitted at the same time as this case. If he violates the terms of his probation, he will be sentenced up to 10 years in prison.
