


# State-ranked Idalou too much for Cubs

The Brownfield Cubs opened a new chapter in their history Friday night, taking the field as a 2A team for the first time. Unfortunately, their opponent for the match-up was the Idalou wildcats, currently ranked third in Texas.

Cub fans got their hopes up early in the first quarter when the Brownfield squad picked up several first downs as they marched toward the end zone on the first possession of the game.

The potential scoring drive was cut short when a big hit by an Idalou defender dislodged the ball from the Cub carrier, allowing a group of Wildcats to jump on the loose ball on the 25-yard line.

The first half was all Idalou after that, as the Wildcats found the end zone five times before the buzzer sounded for halftime.

The 'Cats first score came at the 9:00 mark on a quarterback keeper from Seth Reagan from 30 yards out. Next was a 50-yard run by Koal Houchin with 4:53 to play in the first quarter.

Cub Ryan Caballero picked off a pass on the Wildcat's next possession and returned the ball to the 35-yard line, but as was the case for all of the first half, was unable to convert the play into points.

Less than two minutes into the second quarter, Reagan kept it again for another Idalou touchdown. In a bit of excitement, the point after try was blocked by the Cubs and returned more than 70 yards by Izaiah Marroquin before he was chased down and pushed out before he reached the end zone. Unfortunately, a Cub penalty gave the Wildcat's a second chance at the extra point, which split the uprights, widening the gap to 21-0.

Reagan found the end zone once again at 5:15 p.m. on a quarterback sneak.

With 1:20 remaining in the first half, Idalou score their final touchdown of the night on a rushing play by Houchin.

The Cubs picked up speed in the second half and got on the scoreboard with 7:23 to play thanks to a 30-yard pass from Shacolby Hill to Dylan Huston, who leapt for the ball under heavy coverage in the end zone, but came down with it for the score.

The score narrowed Idalou's lead to 35-7, which would remain for the rest of the game.

Head Coach Bryan Welps told his team after the game to keep their heads up and concentrate on getting better this week to take on the Slaton Tigers at home on Friday.

Kickoff for that District match-up is slated for 7:30 p.m. at Cub

## Broncos open district with win

Now 5-1, the Meadow Broncos opened their district season Friday in Anton with a 73-48 comeback win, and are anticipating three more victories before they accept their trophy.

Things didn't look great from the beginning, though, after the Bulldogs ran two straight touchdowns that the scoreless Broncos could barely defend.

"The first quarter to half we played horrible," said head coach Kent Allison. "We were acting like we weren't interested in being there. We couldn't stop their running game for a while."

The Broncos finally made it to their own

end zone a few times, matching the Bulldogs touchdown for touchdown. A 50-yard touchdown run finally gave them a lead just before halftime, at 37-34.

But after star running back Andrew Flores suffered an injury, sub Zach England unfortunately soon suffered the same fate. Determined to keep fighting while their injured teammates remained in their prayers, Evan Esparza rushed a touchdown and varsity newcomer Jonathan Flores had some good runs. Ironically, having some top players out actually seemed to help their game because of the wake-up call it provided, according to the coach.

"Then we had a sense of urgency and a little guilt because the way we played was

the reason we got hurt," Allison said. "We had lots of kids step up - they had to. These guys overcame it."

By midway into the third quarter, the Broncos were no longer just barely ahead. They ran to their end zone again and again - and landed one touchdown pass, from Brandon Flores to Alan Estrada - while their hosting team only scored twice the entire second half.

## 'Cats come close in final pre-district game

The Wellman-Union Wildcats had a decent night offensively on the road against New Home Friday, but unfortunately it wasn't enough and the 'Cats dropped a 61-26 decision to the Leopards to fall to 1-6 on the season.

The loss to the Leopards wrapped up Wellman-Union's non-district season. Coach Roger Chase's squad will be open next Friday and will open league play on Oct. 26 on the road at Dawson.

The 'Cats kept the game close early as they cut the margin to 13-8 with 3:46 remaining in the first frame on a 37-yard touchdown pass from Kolby Chase to Kaleb Chase.

Kaleb Chase booted the PAT to make the score 13-8.

Unfortunately, after that the 'Cats didn't score again until the fourth quarter and by that time the game was out of hand.

Kaleb Chase scored on a 45-yard run with 7:25 remaining in the fourth frame to make the score 49-14.

Kolby Chase hit Kaleb Chase with a 39-yard touchdown pass to make the score 49-20 with

4:00 remaining in the fourth frame.

Kolby Chase wrapped up he scoring for the 'Cats with a seven-yard touchdown run with 0:17 left in the game to make the final score 61-26.

For the night, the 'Cats had 11 first downs and a total of 337 yards offense, including 251 yards rushing on 45 carries and 86 yards passing on three of eight attempts with zero interceptions.

Kaleb Chase had 155 yards rushing on 18 carries and one touchdown.

Kolby Chase had 88 yards rushing on 23 carries and one touchdown on the ground.

Through the air, Kolby Chase had two completions on six attempts for 76 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Cody Bradley had one completion on two attempts for 10 yards.

Kaleb Chase had three receptions for 86 yards and two passing touchdowns.

New Home had nine first downs and a total of 386 yards offense, including 284 yards rushing on 25 carries and 102 yards passing on five of nine attempts.


