

MEADOW FIRE *— from One*

State Firemen's and Fire Marshals' Association of Texas Executive Director Chris Barron told the *News* that MFD was currently a member of his agency, but they had not had a certification coordinator on record for them since James Smith's provisional certificate expired in 2004. The only "acceptable training record" MFD submitted was for the year 1999, he said, noting that staying up to date on training and certification is more of a recommendation than a requirement for volunteer fire departments.

"Volunteer fire departments in Texas are not regulated, but most of them follow our certification program," he said.

As chief, Williams now has a key to the fire station, Terri McClanahan told the *News*. Before he was appointed, a few local residents had requested Robert Campos and other fire-fighters be issued keys to keep at all times, rather than have to request them from City Hall for use only when needed.

"If there's a fire every minutes counts, and I wonder about a 20-minute delay trying to get a key," McArthur said in the public comment section of the council meeting. He added that he and fellow citizens were disappointed that they had not been able to access the fire truck the morning of Harvest Festival to let Lady Bronco cheerleaders ride on it during the parade, as they had in past years.




