possession, but it was a great punt and left Brownfield on their own 1-yard line.

Hill began the possession throwing from deep within the Cubs end zone, but moved the ball out to the 15-yard line with a pass to senior receiver Dylan Huston.

On the next play, Hill broke away again, going the distance on his second 80-plus-yard run of the young game, for another Cub touchdown, capping a two-minute, 99-yard drive.

Another Munoz extra point increased Brownfield's lead to

14-0 with 7:30 to go in the opening frame.

Three minutes later, Bushland was threatening on third down at the Cubs' 10-yard line, but Simon Jacquez broke through the line and sacked Falcon quarterback Taylor Cornelius, forcing fourth-and-22.

A Bushland field goal attempt was unsuccessful, leaving the Cubs on top by 14 at the end of the first quarter.

The Falcons made it interesting though with a short touchdown run by Frank Byers at the 9:34 mark in the second quarter.

Three minutes later, with 6:26 left in the half, Taylor Cornelius connected with Colter Cornelius on a 40-yard pass play for another score.

The Falcons went for two on the play and found a man in the end zone for the score, taking the lead, 15-14.

The Cubs answered with another touchdown with 1:11 to go in the half.

Sophomore wide receiver Jordan Demps carried the ball across the goal line for the Cubs.

Hill found the end zone for a two-point conversion to put the Cubs back on top 22-15.

The Cub defense put on a show in the final minute of the first half, breaking up several scoring attempts, the last one with no time left on the clock.

Brownfield kept the lead heading into the locker room.

The second half was a battle from start to finish, but one the Cubs couldn't catch a break in.

Brownfield's offense found itself in the red zone on three separate occasions, but couldn't cross the threshold for a score.

On one of the attempts, Hill's pass was bobbled by a Falcon defender then caught by another before stepping out of bounds at the three-yard-line with the interception.

Bushland knotted the score with nine minutes to play in the third quarter on a 20-yard carry by Payton Coldiron, then went on top at the six-minute mark with a 15-yard pass to Carson Paetzold.

The score was 29-22, Falcons, heading into the final frame.

The final touchdown of the contest came on a short run by

Cornelius with 1:49 to play.

Senior Cub Shaun Paiva blocked the extra point attempt, capping the score at 35-22 to end the game.

"I just can't say enough about how far this group has come," Coach Welps told the *Brownfield News* following the game. "This group of seniors are a special bunch of guys and they will go a long way in life. And the rest of the team will be back even stronger next year. We wanted to keep playing, but Brownfield can be proud of all of these young men."
