

Pleas

The following defendants accepted plea-bargained sentences Tuesday morning in Terry County District Court:

Juan Paul Garcia, 38, pleaded to four years probation for driving while intoxicated with a child passenger under 15, a state jail felony.

Garcia will also owe \$438 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee and \$750 fine. He will be required to install a breathing device in his vehicle, spend 10 days in the county jail, attend Alcoholics/Narcotics Anonymous meetings and an alcohol-offenders school and lose his driver's license for 180 days.

If he violates the terms of his probation, he will be sentenced up to 18 months in a state jail.

Raymond Lee Martinez Jr., 19, pleaded to seven years probation for burglary of a habitation, a second-degree felony.

Martinez will also owe \$423 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee, \$450 attorney fees, \$750 fine and \$8,627 restitution.

As part of the plea bargain, the state agreed to dismiss two misdemeanor charges he was facing in Terry County Court. If he violates the terms of his probation, he will be sentenced up to seven years in prison.

Pankie Mae Nolan, 36, pleaded to two years probation for assault causing bodily injury, a class A misdemeanor.

Nolan will also owe \$289 court costs, a \$1,000 fine and \$600 attorney fees.

Nolan was originally charged in the case with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, a second-degree felony. As part of the plea bargain, the state agreed to lower the charge and to dismiss another felony charge she was facing in Terry County District Court.

If she violates the terms of her probation, she will be sentenced up to a year in the county jail.

Elizabeth Ramirez, 51, pleaded to 14 months confinement in a state jail facility for fraudulent use of possession of identifying information, a state jail felony.

Ramirez will also owe \$304 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee and \$300 attorney fees.

Jessica Sebring, 26, pleaded to three years deferred adjudication for possession of less than one gram of methamphetamine, a state jail felony.

Sebring will also owe \$383 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee, \$750 fine, \$300 attorney fees and \$140 restitution and will be required to attend Alcoholics/Narcotics Anonymous meetings and successfully complete Concho Valley Court-Appointed Residential Treatment Center.

If she completes the terms of her probation, the charge will be dismissed in three years.

Tamica Marie Ybarra, 26, pleaded to five years deferred adjudication for possession of between four and 200 grams of methamphetamine with intent to deliver, a first-degree felony.

Ybarra will also owe \$383 court costs, a \$25 time payment fee and \$140 restitution and will be required to attend Alcoholics/Narcotics Anonymous meetings and forfeit cash on a civil case.

If she successfully completes the terms of her probation, the charge will be dismissed in five years.

Sheriff's Report

November 2012

The Terry County Sheriff's Department received only one offense report in November, a theft of a firearm case that has not yet been cleared.

Last month's report, which commissioners approved Monday, indicated the department received 122 total calls, including five emergencies, two misdials and 115 other nonemergencies.

The sheriff's department served 23 of 26 civil papers they received in November from Terry County, while the other three were returned. They served all 13 that they received from other counties.

Deputies served all 60 they received locally and no subpoenas from other counties. They served 11 of the 16 warrants they received from Terry County agencies, including five for County Court and six for District Court. Seven local warrants remained outstanding as of Nov. 30 and two were returned. They received no warrants from other counties.

Deputies made a combined total of seven arrests in November from their own cases and on warrants from other law-enforcement agencies, including two on bond-forfeiture warrants and one each for assault causing bodily injury to a family member, criminal trespass of a habitation or shelter, failure to keep a child in school, motion to revoke probation and theft of property valued between \$50 and \$500.

The Terry County Jail had an average daily population of 55 inmates in November. An average of 32 local inmates stayed at the jail each day that month, as did 3.3 inmates from Hockley County and 3.8 federal inmates.

Four prisoners - three men and one woman - were transferred last month to various facilities of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice prison system.

The jail's total income for the year as of Nov. 30 was \$357,871, the majority of which was income from other counties and federal agencies Terry County contracted with to house prisoners.

Office and jail expenses totaled \$25,704 in November. That amount included \$13,912 for groceries, \$6,507 for utilities, \$3,386 for medical expenses and \$1,852 for other jail expenses. The jail served 4,828 meals last month at an average cost of \$2.88 each.

Officers' travel expenses totaled \$6,280 for the month, most of which was for fuel. They drove 2,102 total miles while transferring a total of 23 inmates to and from facilities in Lubbock, Plainview and San Antonio.
