

Cubs run past C-City

The Brownfield Cubs rolled right past the Colorado City Fighting Wolves in their first-ever District match-up Friday night in the Wolves' own 'Pit' gym.

The Cubs got off to a slow start and even trailed the Wolves for a few minutes to open the game, but quickly took control and ran up a 20-11 lead by the end of the first frame.

The Cubs' speed and tenacious defense proved too much for the Wolves who fell further behind in the second quarter, ending the half trailing 39-19.

Brownfield kept the heat on in the third quarter and maintained its lead, 56-34, by the end of the period.

The fourth quarter was the only one in Friday night's contest that the Wolves tacked on more points than the Cubs, adding 10 to Brownfield's eight.

When the final buzzer sounded, the Cubs had the easy win, 64-44 to win their seventh consecutive game and maintain their undefeated status in District 2-2A with a 3-0 mark.

"We knew they probably weren't going to like our fast pace so that was our game plan heading into this one," said Head Coach Dustin Faught. "We were able to stay a step ahead of them for most of the game and get another 'W' which is always good."

The Cubs were led on the night by senior Shaun Paiva, who had 16 points against the Wolves.

Fellow senior Ricky Rodriguez followed up with 10 points in the contest.

Shacolby Hill and Korey Nolan added nine points each, while Jordan Demps was good for seven.

Cole Garcia notched four points, while Ryan Caballero added three more with one shot from behind the arch.

The Cubs are now 17-6 on the season and haven't lost since they played Panhandle, Dec. 29, in the Caprock Classic tournament in Lubbock.

They will be back on the court Tuesday night when they travel to Coahoma for another first meeting, taking on the Bulldogs in district action.

The Lady Cubs didn't fare as well Friday night, coming up short against the Lady Wolves.

Two Lady Cub starters -- Mallorie Ellis and Gaby Aviles -- remained benched with injuries for the game, leaving Head Coach Derek Faught with only eight girls

sued up after he moved Swayze Lee up from the JV squad.

"It's tough when you have that few girls on your bench," Faught said after the loss. "They need a break and you can get into foul trouble a whole lot faster. We should have beat this team tonight, but we didn't, so now we're going to have to get back in the gym and keep working and figure some things out."

The Lady Cubs struggled early on to get a bucket to fall, finishing the first quarter with four points and only one shot from the floor.

The Lady Wolves were up by three heading into the second frame and extended the lead to 19-12 by halftime.

Brownfield fought back to within a few points on more than one occasion in the game, but Colorady City had an answer every time and continued to widen the gap.

At the end of three, the Lady Wolves were on top, 34-23.

A closer contest in the fourth still wasn't enough to bring the Lady Cubs back into contention as the clock dwindled.

At the final buzzer, the Lady Wolves took the District 2-2A win, 46-34.

The Lady Cubs, 6-18 on the season and 1-4 in District play will take to the road Tuesday to accompany the Cubs to Coahoma.

It is the start of the second half of the district season for the Lady Cubs and Coach Faught said he has confidence his team can turn their season around.

"If we can just get a couple wins under our belt, we're back in the running to place in the district," he said. "If we're healthy and we're playing, we can beat any team we face. We just have to work on getting to that place."





Longhorns gore Wildcats

They trailed the Longhorns by only a few points nearly the entire first half, but kept falling further behind in the second in spite of some great effort.

The Lady Wildcats lost 31-43 to Loop. They traded leads with the Lady Longhorns throughout the first quarter and maintained a slight advantage most of the second, but scored only twice in the third and never could recover.

"We were just too tight tonight and could not get a rhythm going," said Head Coach Todd Ellis. "We were trying too hard, and we just made too many mistakes. The Loop girls capitalized on our mistakes, and we didn't capitalize on theirs."

Scorers included Sierra Wheatley 3-0 1-1 7, Rosa Olivias 1-1 0-2 5, Tristan Baker 1-1 5, Breck Faught 2-0 1-2 5, Tori Browne 0-0 404 4, Abi Lindsey 1-0 1-2 3 and Lexi Olivias 1-0 2.

GIFTED AND TALENTED PROGRAM

Dear Parents:

The Brownfield I.S.D. offers a variety of programs to meet the special needs of students. One such program is The Gifted and Talented Program for the academically and intellectually able students. Through this program, the District is striving to help students who have exhibited potentially gifted characteristics in areas of language arts, math, science and social studies.

All students in kindergarten through twelfth grade are eligible to be nominated for this program for the 2012-2013 school year. The process for selecting the students who will participate in the Gifted and Talented Program will begin immediately with nominations from parents, other relatives, teachers, administrators, counselors, peers and community people. Students already identified and placed in the program do not need to be re-nominated.

The District will screen all students nominated to decide their entry into the program. No fewer than three criteria will be used to measure gifted characteristics and will include other items besides test scores. After initial screening, those students who meet the necessary criteria will be given further intellectual testing before the District makes the final selection. Written permission from parents will be secured for any testing beyond the initial screening.

If you are interested in nominating a student for The Gifted and Talented Program, all necessary forms can be picked up from the principal's office of the student's school. Kindergarten and first grade forms can be picked up starting January 21st. Nominations for Kindergarten students must be turned in by February 1, 2013 and nominations for first grade students must be turned in by February 22, 2013. Nominations for all other grades are due by April 1, 2013.
